Stratmoor Hills Water District to Receive \$680,000 in ARPA Grant Funding

In late September, the Stratmoor Hills Water District received a portion of \$20.9 million in federal funds awarded to El Paso County under the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA). These funds were a necessary investment in water / wastewater infrastructure. The Water District was awarded \$680,000 to help rehabilitate the emergency interconnection with Colorado Springs Utilities.

The interconnection with CSU is quit outdated and in need of several upgrades to make operational. This interconnection is extremely important to the Stratmoor Hills Water District and would be used if there was a catastrophic failure in the water distribution system.

In 2023, the District will work with our engineering partner, Forsgren Engineering, to develop and build a brand new state-of-the-art emergency interconnection with Colorado Springs Utilities. This connection will be an above ground structure and will meet all of CSU's specifications for operations.



- Stay in the kitchen when you are cooking on the stovetop so you can keep an eye on the food.
- Stay in the home when cooking your turkey and check on it frequently.
- Keep children away from the stove. The stove will be hot and kids should stay 3 feet away.
- Make sure kids stay away from hot food and liquids. The steam or splash from vegetables, gravy or coffee could cause serious burns.
- Keep the floor clear so you don't trip over kids, toys, pocketbooks or bags.
- Keep knives out of the reach of children.
- · Be sure electric cords from an electric knife, coffee maker, plate warmer or mixer are not dangling off the counter within easy reach of a child.
- Keep matches and utility lighters out of the reach of children - up high in a locked cabinet.
- Never leave children alone in room with a lit candle.
- Make sure your smoke alarms are working. Test them by pushing the test button.



Have activities that keep kids out of the kitchen during this busy time. Games, puzzles or books can keep them busy. Kids can get involved in Thanksgiving preparations with recipes that can be done outside the kitchen
